What is a Research Questionnaire?

- Data Collection Tool
 - Series of questions or items used to collect information from respondents
 - Intent is to standardize data
 - May be part of a study using mixed methods or not
- Reliability & Validity
 - Consistent results
 - Measures what it claims to measure

- Classifications:
 - Mode of Administration Self-reported or Researcher/Interviewer reported
 - Mode of Format structured, semi-structured, matrix

What is a Research Questionnaire?

- Validated
 - Tested and published in the literature
 - Population/context/purpose for which it was developed matters
- Unvalidated
 - Not published
 - Usually custom to a given study

Translations

- Validated
 - Tested in the language into which it has been translated
 - Proven to be valid and reliable
 - Published
- Unvalidated
 - May have validated English (or other language) version
 - Not validated in other languages

Review -General Requirements

- Is what the questionnaire claims to measure relevant to the aims of the research?
- If validated, do not need to submit, but should give name of tool and specify that it is validated with appropriate reference
- If unvalidated:
 - Are the questions worded appropriately (respectfully)?
 - Are the questions eliciting information that is relevant to what the tool claims to be measuring?

Review of Translations

- Study must be approved to enroll non-English speakers
- If validated in language into which it has been translated, do not need to submit
 - Should specify name of questionnaire and that it is validated with reference

- If validated in one language but not validated in language into which it has been translated OR no language is validated/custom tool:
 - PI must identify a qualified translator
 - Translator must sign a letter of attestation or provide certificate of translation (commercial service)
